Everything in the world must have something or somene to care for it to enable it to \$\(\frac{\psi}{2} \) live and grow. As the children need a teacher, so also, the souls need a Haster. Who are these Masters who train the souls in spiritual knowledge?

They are the Prophets, who teach in the school of GOD, and they are the greatest and highest of all teachers and instructors.

To the revered members assembled point out the Hague conference held before the war had as its president the Emperor of Russia and its members were men of the greatest eminence. Notwithstanding this it did not prefent this terrible war. How now will it be? For in the future a more terrible war will assuredly take place. Verily, of this there is no doubt. What can the Hague meeting do?

Regarding Prayer, Mrs. Cooper and Mrs. Frankland said Abdul
Baha advised that all pray for others more than for themselves, as
that will help us to become less salfish, and as we pray for the bounties to be showered upon others, we draw them in this way to ourselves.

Amidst great lamentation and weeping, for we are told that Mrs.

Hoagg was in tears all the time Abdul Baha was speaking on the subject,
we are told that Abdul Baha upholds capital punishment and said that
if a man took a life, he should pay for that life with his own life.

When His attention was called to the suffering endured by a person
awaiting such a punishment, He said that if such a person was really
penitent, by that rue ponitence he redeemed his soul. In other words,
through that real penitence he saved his soul.

The subject of the 19-day Fast was also spoken of: this is the Past from March 2nd. to March 20th. Mrs. Frankland said it seemed to har as though Abdul Baha laughed down His sleeve at them all the time they talked about this subject, as He thinks so little of fasting, whil we make so much of it. Some one asked, should one fast when it was so inconvenient to do so--that is, get up early before probably the rest of the family were around, and Abdul Baha said, "What is a little inconvenience?" He said all should fast. When told that it was said that was the age limit, He smiled at them and said there was no limit and whan pushed for an answer said 70 years was the limit. He said nothing should pass the Tips from sunrise to sunset.

Mr. Wall asked the Easter for any suggestions as to the meetings in Chicago, and how the Cause might be more rapidly spread.

Abd I Baha said! Tach one of the friends should try to guide one souls—those who are worthy—not the persons who enter the Jauseend bring degradation to it; not like Farced. If he had been not been a Bahai, it would have been much bester. The people who are pure and sincere will not be the cause of degradation to it. *Know that the return of Christ for a mecond time do es not mean that the people believe, but rather signifies the One promised to come after Him. "Verily, Christ came with H₄s Kingdom from the beginning, which has no beginning, and will come with His Kingdom to the eternity of Eternities, inasmuch as, in this sense, Christ isan expression of the Divine Reality, the single Essence and Heavenly Entity, which hath no beginning or ending. It has appearance, arising, and manifestation and setting in each one of the cycles.

"Concerning thy question what Christ arose for a second time;
Verily, Christ (Upon HIm be greeting and praise!) never dies! God,
the Emalted, has said; 'Think not that those who were killed in the
Path of God are dead; nay, rather, they are living and fed by their
Lord.' Again: 'The believer (in God) is alive in both this and the
next world.' If this station be true of the people of faith, how much
more true it is of the Prophets (Upon them be glory and peace!).

"As to the ascension of Christ unto the Supreme Apex, the Sublime Heaven and the Mighty Firmament -- know, verily, heaven is applied to the visible phenomenonk but the Reality thereof is the Supreme Station, the Highest Summit, the Sublime Mansion and the Supreme Kingdom, where Christ ascended.

"He said: 'No cms will ascend to heaven save Him who has descended from it.' Thus it is proven that He descended from heaven, while

outwardly He descended from the womb of Mary.

Christ is eternally in H, s Heaven, the Highest Station and most Supreme Summit. Glery be unto my Dord, the Supreme!"

"Ther know that for the Reality of Christ there is no beginning and there is so end. Everlastingly that luminous Entity has been sitting on the Thrine of Might, and everlastingly It will have a penetgating deminion over the worlds of existence. This Deminion is eternal and everlasting, and has no abrupt end."

"Likewise the address of the angels to the people of Galilee that 'this Christ will return in the same way and that He will descend from heaven', is a spiritual address. For when Christ appeared He came from heaven, although He was outwardly born from the womb of Mary.

For He said; 'No man hatherscended up to heaven, but He that came down from heaven.' He said; 'I have come from heaven and will likewise go to heaven.' By 'heaven' is not meant the infinite phenomenal space, but 'heaven' signifies the world of the Divine Kingdom, which is the Supreme Station and seat of the Sun of Truth. To be brief: the mysteries of the Holy Books are many, and require explanation and elucidation. I hope thine insight will be so opened that the Divine Mysteries may become manifest and dlear." (page 192, Tablets of A.B. Vol. I.)

Hannen, of Washington, D. C.; also, we are preparing to continue the Diary of the daily events surrounding Abdul-Baha in 1914, recently translated by Dr. Zia M. Bagdadi. Seven issues of Vol. IX have thus far been published and mailed, issues No. 8 and No. 9 are now on the press and No. 10 and No. 11 will follow soon.

When an issue is mailed our mailing list is carefully checked and unless your name has been taken from the list, you may rest assured that the non-receipt of a copy is not due to an oversight or negligence at this end. Therefore, should a copy fail to reach you, at any time, your kind co-operation in promptly notifying us will be deeply appreciated, and we shall, in that event, be glad to send you another copy. We were informed recently that a few of the friends in western states had not received all of their copies; hence this solicitation of your co-operation to complete your files. In July of that year, in an attempt to cross the Arabian Desert in the height of the summer, he suffered a heat stroke which, not only compelled him to abandon the attempt, but to him to abandon the attempt, but to return to England on sick leave. En route, he was torpedoed in the S.S. Mooltah, but reached England to spend a month in the secretariat of the War Cabinet. He returned to Expyr late in 1917 to resume political work. Extracts from Shogi Rabbani's Notes

June 8th, 1919.

The eternal edifice of the Maskrakol-Azkar of Eskabad, its perfection, its importance and its unique role was the sole absorbing theme of our conversation and the subject of our thoughts. This imposing monument is nearing perfection; its dome, large and brilliant, looms from afar; the Greatest Name, carved in gold and on large, conspicuous characters, reflects the rays of the sun, while all of its accessories have been provided and many of its branches, such as school for girls, orphanage, reception rooms and hospital are nearing completion. Its nine attractive gardens are completely encircling the Temple, intercepted by nine spacious alleys and having each at their central portion a magnificent fountain with beautiful jets deau that add much to the beauty and charm of the place. Electric lights flash amid the trees that cover with their extensive branches these fountains and in such a cool and lovely place the friends gather and offer to the Almighty God their prayers and their praise. Although the public park in that city is wide and imposing yet comparatively speaking it is forlorn and forsaken, the attraction and charm of the gardens encircling the Temple by far surpassing the beauty of the park. Not a visitor, not a passerby, not a resident comes to the city without visiting this matchless spot, without expressing his admiration and astonishment at such an exceptional set of buildings, so strongly built, so magnificently designed and so richly provided. Many have made the following remark:

"He who erected this edifice and laid the foundation of such a monument is assuredly Divine."

Then referring to the Maskrakol-Azkar, the Beloved said:

"The Temple of Eskabad is unique in that it is the first Temple of the kind that has been erected. Many such temples shall be constructed in future but this one will ever enjoy this unique privilege and preference. Without waiting to hear that my last letter from here has reached your, I hasten to send you the enclosures , which I anow you will Maxwelcone. One is through a talk I had with the Master, and the rest is through Shoghi. As the others will doubtless get the diary before you, so my letters will supply the want. I do hope also that the winter months will find Ahmadf in your midst. How changed I hope is the former condition among the believer Shall eagerly await your later letters. Shoghi works like "astreak of greas lightning" as I believe the Americans have it. He is really quite unusual for an Criental, and gets through an amazing amount of work unaided. He lets me come in and type odds and ends if I want to in his little sanctorium and I help him over English expressions at times. When I read any special things I will try to send them out to you. At present the Master is always occupied over pilgrims coming and going. The holiday season brings on students and ch ldren, and visitors overflow every where, and as some twenty or more pilgrims have arrived from Bonday and Persia, women too with them, one wonders where on earth all are going to sleep and be housed generally. The Baba's Tomb buildings, Guest house and all are full, and to add to the crowding there the Master is allowing the English Military Governor of Acca to send his wife, babies and servants up there to camp and sleep in the one big empty room.

The Beloved is threless, keeps fairly well, and gives his reception talker to the use every evening. Lotfullah of London using here is taiting down all he can and hopes to return with many sneaves gleaned from the kaster/sgarden of thought pre he leaves. Now such I wish a few good articles could be written on all that is going forward, but such is RMEX private to outsiders.

Every now and then some distinguished E glishman calls and I expect articles will eventually follow. Major M -- ,in the typed MSs., goes to Teheran to promote transit by Aviation in Pornia, but when the green are no roads or rai. This is an admiral idea. He amove Pornia, but was not brawn to interest himself in the Beatai Movement till after. He is now looking that the shelf bash several talks with Abdul Baha and went with Shoghi to see the Holy Toph at Acca. I famey he has been somewhat in the hands of Ezols in Toheran for he was used surprised to search that the Bab's recalms were KOMMAK here.

Tell darr one I am living the life that is a rest and change to me, and although I got and sometimes when I see the Holy Family so over worked and often ill for want of change, yet I mer yery happy. It is revitalizing need

for me and my health in spite of the hot weather is not er.

Do you know the Master is expecting a motor car from America? The garage is being built of white stone next the house, and in front of ot, so a large portion of the lovely garden is savrificed. But what a blessing XXXXIXXXXXX it will be to have quick transit between here and Acca, although there is trainscrute now. The array have so much motor-truck traction about that the dust every where is fearful and the reads cut up. Property is unprocurable as a Government order prohibits buying and seeling till the country is in established order.

There are certain properties, formally Syrian, I should like to see acquired by the Bahais. An adjacent house is badly needed now as a Guest House, I am suggesting Bombay Bahais should come here and open a restaurant near by and so relieve much soxing pressure that the Household have now to bear. The Bombay people are all in the sating-shop business and could underMEXIM take this job now that the rotten Turkish Government is over. So much on the besiness side wants to be loosed into now for the Gause. In London, I have told the Kaster, we have absolutely no co-operation with the States. The Apericans would be doing a useful work if they could in some way or there M21 open a Bahai selling and lending Library agency, so that publications from all over the world could go to a fixed address etc.
Well dear good bye, no more time to continue this chat; I have to write always

under interruptions of one kind or another. I hope we meet next year. The Maste will send no travelling after this winter.

Four letters have been received from you, the last dated april 18th, 1919. All of them were indicative of firmness in the great Covenant. Their movement is like unto the attraction of steel which is subjected to magnetic power; their aims are confined to the good ple sure of God and their highest wish centers around the Unbounded Blessing. They are engaged in service and are intimately connected with the Scoly Spirit.

Then hast referred to the little assembly of Los Anneles. Although that assembly is small, yet it is kept under the guarding of God. If it proves firm and steadfast it shall resist all that is on earth.

Consider how many souls arose after his holine as Christ and determined to extinguish the Lamp of God. Even the Roman Emperor, who was a most eminent phiposother, exerted the uthorst effort in order Apresist this sweeping lovement; he wrote a refutatry wook against his holiness Carist, published it throughout his empire and caused a great many to turn away from his nollness Carist. But, eventually, the Power of the Word of God conquered and oroxe all imperial restistance.

Dear Friends .-

When cur friends George Latimer and Wash-Randell were in Haifa recently Abdul Baha intimated to them that the time had now come to establish the Houses of Spirituality or Spiritual Assamblies through cut the country. The following are extracts from their notes on this subject, also notes of Dr. Esalement.

Mr.Randell .- On my return to America shall I suggest that the Assemblics or Spiritual Houses be patterned after ther Persian Method and their conduct conform to the same proceeding- if this is the Master's :

wish?

Abdol Baha-"Yes. Do not forget this- that this is a Universal Temple; xxx advertise it an announce that this is for all and every Religion, and the that whoever wishes can come and worship."

W.E.P .- Shall the Spiritual House of the Assembly have supervision over and vigilantly guard and protect the Cause and the pure-hearteaness of

its members?

Abdul Baha-"Very Good. Like this- first of all the members must choose a a committee of certain persons from among themselves and then this committee should choose the Spiritual House."

W.H.R.- Should this House consist of nine? Abdul Baha-"Yes, nine." W.H.R .- Not more? about Baha-"It is not bad but not less than nine;" ..

In Dr.E's notes, Abdul Baha says-"As to the House of Spirituality the first question relates to its election. The election should be corriecut with sincerity and scawill. People should be elected who will when united give the most harmony. Members should be elected who are experienced in the Cause and sufficiently educated. Their character must be accu.

The "persian Method" of conjucting the house of Spirituality, referred to by Mr.Randall, is as fellows: General Meetings- These are held several times a week in a town, nonbelivers are welcome; they are especially for teaching and guiding the people and strangthening new Bahais; tablets and prayers are chanted, by the most melodicus voices; statements and proofs are given, talks. about customs, deeds and morals; one or more presidents (chairmen) take charge of the meeting, speakers and subjects are arranged before. Bahais should go to a meeting as to the presence of God; they come in xxx such simplicity and devotion that if any one sees thom they will be quickened. (How do they treat hypocrites and those who do not live up to their professions?) They have special meetings for teaching those people. Teachers who are especially firm and well-informed take in hand these people and inform them as to their duties and train them. (What are the duties of the Spiritual Assembly?) Teaching the Cause and spreading the Message; discussing the ways and means of using the same. There is a collection box or fund for spreading the Cause which is ad-...inistered by the Spiritual Assembly; the fund is used for any purpose apprived by the Spiritual Assembly- helping the pior, teaching, etc. **** Their are contributions and laws as to the expenditures- a derivain percontage for teaching, for helping the poor, etc. No collections are taken at the general meetings; the money is given by those wife are real Bahaia, the public is not asked to give. Any Bahai in trouble can apply to the Spiritual Assembly, and they will advise with him. The Spiritual Assembly appoints a certain person to be to the General meetings to expound the laws and exhort the people to their observance.

The Spiritual Assembly appoints a committee to superintent the feasts; every Bahai (roup hust give a feast once in nineteen days. The Committee has a special book which they bring to a friend and he agrees to give a feast or feasts on certain dates. Any one who wishes to give a feast arranges the dates and time with this committee.******
Feasts for all the Behaia (in town) cour only on special days.

" All Bahal activities should be subject to the approval of the Spiritual Associbly. The Spiritual Associbly should be the focus from which the light of the Kingdon radiates. If the Spiritual Associbly is not pure and spiritual, the Cause cannot progress in that two. The frience has tradice that they has obey the Spiritual Associbly."

As to the duties of the Spiritual Assembly, about Baha says "The first duty is the effect their wom unity and harmony in order to cotain as sect results; -- when the unity of the Committee is established, their second duty is to read the verses and communes, to be in a state of commenceation and minifold. Heast they may see each ther as if in the presence of God; the third duty is consultation and meditation relating the teaching of the Cause of God in all relates and clines; their fourth auty is to meditate and consult for the helping of the poor and the weak and the protection of the sick; their fifth outy is to correct and manufer the affairs of the friends and to attend to ther matters concoming the Cause." "The members of the Spiritual Assembly must well known and firm bahais; the greatest requirement is to be firm and stead-fast in the Occenant."

The Selective Committee appointed at the meeting of the friends of Los Angeles and vicinity, addressed by Mr. Latimer, at which these words were first diven to us, met according to its instructions and elected by unanimous action the following persons as the House of Spirituality for the Assemblies of Los Angeles, Gendule and Pasadena-Mrs. Ros V Winterburn, Mrs. Stuart French, Mrs. Win Cline, Mrs. Lord Beckett Mrs. H. Hibby, Mrs. Oral A Platt, L.R. Alderson, W.H. Cline and Frank B. Beckett. This House of Spirituality was chosen for a period of one year from March 21st, 1920.
